* FRIENDLY REMINDER *

There is a \$6 room tray fee per meal for and resident who declines to eat in the dining room and requests a meal in their room. An exception to this is for any resident on hospice nearing the end of life, is quarantined to their room or has a physician order.

SKYPE APPOINTMENTS are available to anyone wishing to visit virtually. Please call Maranda between 8a.m.- 4 p.m. to schedule your appointment!

COVID-19 Update: Please continue to check your email and/or mail for changes and updates to our visiting policy. We are hoping to return to Phase 2 on October 9th pending our current quarantine is completed. Due to the current public COVID-19 status, please understand our visiting policy may change abruptly at any time.

Phase 2 includes:

- Open salon & foot care/podiatry services to those designated to work within the facility only
- Anyone entering the facility must sign in, wash their hands with soap and water, wear a mask, log temperature and complete symptoms questionnaire
- Residents are strongly encouraged to wear a mask when not in the facility
- TeleMed is still preferred doctor appointment choice, though residents are able to attend appointments when medically necessary.
- 14-day quarantine is no longer required upon return to the facility unless there is a known positive exposure
- Families may take residents out of the facility for a car ride, without an appointment needed. We do ask you to notify staff in advanced so we are aware the resident is leaving the facility.
- We highly encourage residents to wear a face mask when leaving the facility, use proper hand hygiene, social distance and know their surroundings. Keeping in mind any personal potential exposure may also expose others within the facility upon return.
- **Allow Limited Outside Family Visits**
 - Family must wear and provide their own mask
 - Must remain 6 feet apart from resident
 - Each resident is allowed to have **4 visitors** at a time
 - Visits must take place in designated areas only
 - Must call the facility Monday- Friday between 8:00a.m – 4:00p.m. to schedule visit time
- **Allow Limited Family Visits in family room- ONLY** if resident is physically unable to visit outside, which will be approved by the director
 - Anyone entering the facility must sign in, wash their hands with soap and water, wear mask, log temperature and complete symptom questionnaire
 - Must remain 6 feet apart from resident
 - Each resident is allowed to have up to **2 visitors** at one time
 - Maximum of 45 minutes per indoor visit.
 - Must call facility Monday-Friday 8:00a.m.-4:00p.m. to schedule visit time, in order to regulate the number of people within the facility.
 - Staff to assist resident with washing hands after visit

VISITING SUGGESTIONS:

Bring your own mask and wear for the entire visit *Restrooms will **NOT** be available to visitors *Visitors are **NOT ALLOWED** to enter the facility *Please call when you arrive for your visit, or ring the doorbell *Packages must be sanitized by staff

Dutch Apple Pie

6 cups sliced cored peeled apples
 1/3 cup granulated sugar
 3 tablespoons all-purpose flour
 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
 1/4 teaspoon salt
 1/8 teaspoon ground nutmeg
 1 tablespoon lemon juice

Toppings

1/3 cup cold butter
 3/4 cup all-purpose flour
 3/4 cup packed brown sugar
 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon

1. Place piece of foil on oven rack below middle rack to catch drips. Heat oven to 400°F. Place pie crust in 9-inch glass pie plate as directed on box for *One-Crust Filled Pie*.
2. In large bowl, toss filling ingredients until evenly coated. Spoon into crust-lined pie plate, mounding apples toward center.
3. In medium bowl, mix topping ingredients, using pastry blender or fork until crumbs form. Sprinkle over apples.
4. Bake 45 - 55 minutes, or until pie crust and crumb topping are deep golden brown and filling begins to bubble. After 15 minutes of baking, cover top of pie and crust loosely with foil to prevent excessive browning. Transfer to cooling rack. Cool at least 3 hours before serving.
